Award categories:

- **Lycetts Leadership Award**

This award is for licensed British trainers. There are four sections that make up the Lycetts Leadership Award and all are Excellence Awards. These sections are based on The Winning Approach, a set of industry standards in management and employment practices. Trainers can enter just one or multiple sections.

Prize: £4,000 awaits the winning Trainer to spend on their business

- **Lycetts Team Champions Award**
