Abusive communications have become an ever-increasing concern in today's digital age and the PJA recognises the importance of taking a proactive stance against such behaviours. Leading this project is former police Superintendent, Sean Memory, who brings a wealth of expertise in the management of investigations. It is recognised that identifying the individual behind anonymous messages is very challenging in the digital age. Sean's skills in doing so will be of great value in getting to a stage where the BHA and/or police are able to act.
